Lesson Title	Understanding and fighting racism in football
Target Group	Young players in grassroots football
Learning Outcomes of the Module	<ul> <li>Upon completion of this module, players should be able to:</li> <li>Identify what racism looks like in football and provide real examples</li> <li>Recognise forms of racism and discrimination in football at the level of players</li> <li>Discuss ways racism affects football (players, coaches, managers, etc.) and illustrate impact/effects on players</li> </ul>
Lesson duration	1 hour
Preparation	The coach must prepare the theoretical content of the lesson and the practical exercises and make sure s/he has at disposal all afferent educational resources. Minimal technical necessary equipment: laptop/PC, PC projector, Internet connection  Players' prerequisites: basic knowledge and information regarding diversity and inclusion

Topics	Learning Activities	Duration in minutes (indicative)	Training Methods (e.g. presentation group activity etc.)	Materials & Equipment Needed
	The coach:  - presents football as an environment still marked by racism and exemplifies what racism looks like in football  - describes forms of racism and discrimination of football players  - provides examples of racist acts in football adapted to the age and level of understanding of the player-learners and explains the examples  - emphasizes on the physical and psychological effects of racism on football players and illustrates with real cases these impact/effects on players		Presentation	PPT created by the coach Laptop/PC PC projector Internet connection Whiteboard
	Based on all previously discussed issues, to make the connection with the next activity, the coach:  - asks the class if they understand the racism in football, its forms and effects.  - asks learners to share their understanding of the issues  - on a whiteboard writes down what the learners are sharing, to refer to later in the next activity  - splits the class in two equal groups;  - asks each group to create a Code of Conduct for their football club (or school) that includes a protocol for calling out/addressing those who do not abide by the code of conduct respectfully  - while working, recommends groups to fructify ideas summarised on the whiteboard, adapt and include them in the code of conduct  - when finished, asks each group to share their Code and discuss rules and how they must start implement them in own		Reading Debate Group work	Whiteboard
